

Make Sure Your Dog has a Guelph/Eramosa Dog Tag!

It is important to get an annual dog tag because:

- If your pet strays from home, it will be retrieved by Guelph Humane Society.
- A dog tag provides us with the ability to contact you so that your dog can be identified and reunited with you.
- You will get contacted immediately if your dog is injured and is being transported to a veterinarian for care.
- It's the law! By-law 80/2016 requires that all dogs in Guelph/Eramosa have a Township dog tag license.



Did you know? Guelph/Eramosa Township has increased the number of dogs to 3 per household.

In 2016, Guelph/Eramosa Township was pleased to partner with Guelph Humane Society for animal control services.

Guelph Humane Society provides many services on behalf of our community:

- Responding 24/7 to injured or sick animals (including wildlife) that are in need of care,
- Responding to by-law concerns, such as dogs running at large, failure to “stoop and scoop,” etc.
- Responding to public safety concerns, including aggressive dogs, including bites or attacks.



Our dog tag fees have increased in 2017.

Why the increase?

- Our dog tag fees have not increased since 2002.
- Our new dog tag fees now compare with neighbouring municipalities.
- Our animal services costs have increased.
