

Rockwood to get new traffic signals on Highway 7 at MacLennan Street and Dunbar Street

ROCKWOOD, Ontario, June 23, 2017: Guelph/Eramosa Township announces that it is partnering with the Ontario Government to increase safety on Highway 7 with the installation of new traffic signals at the intersection of MacLennan and Dunbar.

“I am very pleased with this Provincial announcement. This was a major safety concern for our residents and I want to express a heartfelt thanks to Minister Liz Sandals and Minister Del Duca for their foresight in moving forward with this traffic light,” Mayor Chris White said.

“This is a very busy and potentially dangerous school crossing and this traffic light is critical for the safety of our children and our residents,” Mayor White continued. “I also want to give a special thanks to our MPP Ted Arnott, who worked continually on this and was pivotal in getting this done. I would also like to thank Jen MacLeod and all the folks at the school and in the community who worked to resolve this issue. I look forward to the installation of this light.”

Mayor Chris White was joined by Liz Sandals, MPP for Guelph and Wellington-Halton Hills MPP Ted Arnott for the announcement in Rockwood.

The traffic signals will increase safety for all road users, especially those travelling to and from the École Harris Mill Public School, which is located at the end of MacLennan Street. The work will also include extending the westbound left turn lane, adding lighting, and improving accessibility features for everyone who crosses the road at this location.
